## School Management Committee (SMC) Survey

The objectives of the SMC Survey were to collect information on the role of the SMC of each school in different school management activities, its strategies to address the problems and improvement in teaching-learning environment, relationship with school community such as interaction with parents and participation in local community events, perception of the role of the local government in educational development, etc. The average time taken to complete each SMC Survey was 67.02 minutes. The interview was administered in Paper and Pencil Based Interview (PAPI) format.

The SMC Survey interviews were conducted with the president of the School Management Committee (SMC) of each selected school. All interviews were conducted in Nepali language at their home. In order to protect confidentiality, eligible respondents were interviewed privately by a single interviewer. Each interviewer obtained verbal consent from each respondent participating in the SMC survey. All interviews were done face-to-face.

Out of 114 eligible respondents, 109 SMC interviews were completed resulting in a 95.6% completion rate. 5 interviews were incomplete which included 3 refusals and 2 within Nepal but outside of Chitwan.

Axinn, Population Studies Center, Survey Research Center, University of Michigan; and Co-investigator Prof. Dr. Brian Rowan, Institute for social research, Stanford University led the project.
